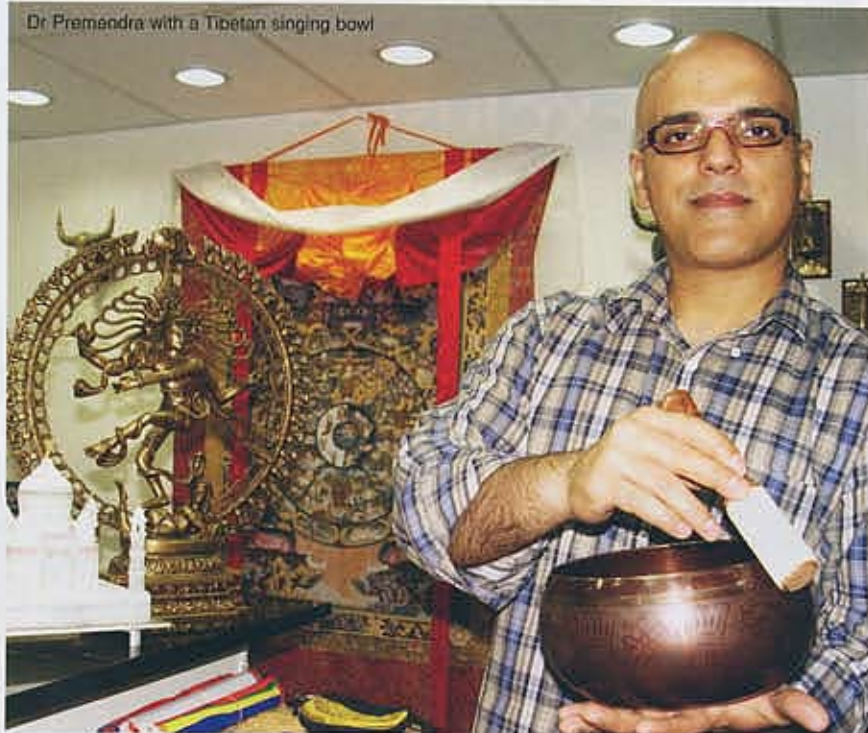
The shop offers an eye-catching range of unusual, rare yet affordable items from India and Himalayas.
